Arnold Lobel's beloved children's book. A Year with Frog and Toad arrives on our Riverwalk main stage December 8 for nine performances. This whimsical family musical tells the story of two best friends: the cheerful Frog, and curmudgeonly Toad. The musical follows them through four colorful seasons, from hibernation to hibernation.

Frog and Toadalong with their playful, quirky friends Snail, Turtle, the Birds, and more — have many adventures, from rushing down a snowy hill

in a runaway sled, to an encounter with Large and Terrible Frog to baking cookies, cookies, cookies.

In Riverwalk Theatre's version, brothers Connor Kelly and Quinn Kelly play the Frog and Toad. "Although we've been in other plays together," said Connor, "this is the first time we have played opposite each other in leading roles." "We're having a great time playing off each other," added Quinn.

Director Tom Ferris, Musical Director Kait Wilson and Choreographer Fran Ludington have put together a fast-paced production that will entertain the whole family. Children and adults alike will relish the joyful vignettes of A Year with Frog and Toad, which feature catchy tunes, funny dialogue, energetic dancing and bright, memorable characters.

Riverwalk Theatre teams up with Lansing Reading is Fundamental (RIF) for a special performance on Wednesday, December 14 at 7 pm. "We're thrilled to be working with RIF again," said Ferris. "We are pleased to help them in their mission of motivating all children to discover the joy of reading which will then evolve into lifetime personal reading habits. Riverwalk Theatre supports this mission by providing opportunities for children



(and adults) to see the books they read come to life on our stage." Following the performance every child under 18 in attendance will be able to choose a RIF book to take home.

Riverwalk Theatre is also partnering with Preuss Pets to support the Panamanian Golden Frog Project. Sean Murphy will attend the Wednesday, December 14 RIF performance, and the Sunday, December 11 and 18 performances to present the education ambassador animals from Preuss Pets. The audience will have the opportunity to interact with their 80-year-old South American Red-Footed Tortoise. Sean will also present some information about Project Golden Frog and why the project exists to preserve the culturally significant golden frog of Panama as a flagship species for amphibian decline issues worldwide.

Fabulation or the Re-Education of Undine...

... was a fantastic tale about a powerful, professional, African American woman who was living her best life until it all came tumbling down. Undine Barnes Calles, played by the extremely talented Vanessa Mazhangara, captured the audience immediately by displaying her confidence and wielding her power over her assistant Stephie, played by Jillian Tosolt. Undine knew exactly what she wanted and how to get it — until she discovered her husband Herve, played by charismatic, smooth, and debonair Lorenzo Lopez, had stolen ALL her hard-earned money.


This sudden change of fortune forced Undine to return to Brooklyn where she had grown up in the Walt Whitman projects. Once home, she found it difficult to reconnect with her family and friends because she had rejected their lifestyle to pursue her dreams of fabulosity.

Undine, pregnant, broke, and living back with her parents, was desperate to regain her sense of well-being and worked hard to figure out what was next. She even sought guidance from a Yoruba Priest, hoping he could tell her if she would regain her fortune.

It is hard to believe that *Fabulation* was Director Rose Jangmi Cooper's first full-stage production. Cooper's choice of a mod-

est stage that easily transformed from business office to project apartment to a doctor's office and even a jail cell was flawless. A large projection screen helped with scene transitions. The set was simplistic. Still, Cooper did not miss a beat with the everyday details down to the repurposed Crown Royal bag.

The 11-member cast tackled 32 roles with ease and precision. The ensemble was truly dynamic: "Guy" played by Wulf Hogan, "Mother" played by Timetra Horton, "Father" played by Julian Van Dyke, the hilarious "Grandma"





played by Janell Hall, "Rapper/Flow" (Norrlyn-Michael Allen), "Allison" (Nykieria Blocker), "Doctor" (Teriah Nicole), and "Priest" (Jordan Taylor).

Ashley Hampton, dubbed "Costume Fabulator," did a great job and we could tell she had fun selecting the right wardrobe. This show was a hit on stage and backstage with experienced crew: Diane Cooke (Stage Manager), Tom Ferris (Set Design), Michelle Harvey-Hill (Projector Tech), Clint Hoagland (Soundscaper), Bernie Lucas (Set and Props Wrangler), Scott Pohl (Publicity/Engagement Rep), Greg Pratt (Light Tech), Maureen Sawdon (Assistant Director) and Steve Vangel (Light Design).

This play lived up to its name. It was a creation of Fabulation. Gay Oliver







The action is set in Truvy's beauty salon in Chinquapin, Louisiana, where all the ladies who are "anybody" come to have their hair done. Helped by her eager new assistant, Annelle, the outspoken, wise-cracking Truvy dispenses shampoos and free advice to the town's rich curmudgeon, Ouiser; an eccentric millionaire, Miss Clairee, who has a raging sweet tooth; and the local social leader, M'Lynn, whose daughter, Shelby, is about to marry a "good ole boy."

Filled with hilarious repartee and not a few acerbic but humorously revealing verbal collisions, the play moves toward tragedy in the second act. The sudden realization of their mortality impacts all, but also draws on the underlying steely strength — and love—which give the play, and its characters, the special quality to make them truly touching, funny and marvelously amiable company in good times and bad.

Truvy Jones - (female 40-50) Owner of a small town beauty salon. She knows everyone's business and shares it with anyone who will listen. Southern Belle

M'Lynn Eatenton - (female 50-60) Mother of Shelby. She is overprotective at times. A busy woman who worries for her friends and family.

Annelle Dupuy-Desoto - (female 20-30) Very shy 20-year-old hair-dresser. She goes from a very soft-spoken person to a bible-loving Christian with her heart on her sleeve.

Shelby Eatenton-Latcherie - (female 20-30) 25-year-old diabetic. Prettiest girl in town, and loved by all. Has a close, but sometimes strained relationship with her mother.

Clairee Belcher - (female 60s)
Widow of the former mayor.
She is wealthy and knows everyone's business. She is the sarcastic member of the group, poking fun at the little things others cry over.

Ouiser Boudreaux - (female 60s) A wealthy biddy. She is a loveably miserable lady with a unique personality and sense of humor.

Exec Committee Update


Greetings and warmth to RWT friends near and far this December from myself and the Riverwalk Board of Directors. I hope your holidays are off to a lovely start and you can to find time for rest and relaxation amid the chaos this season can bring.

I'd like to provide a few recent updates and keep you apprised of some changes coming down the pipeline. As you may have heard, masks are now optional for everyone in our building. Thursday night performances will still be sold at half capacity with socially distanced seating,

with audience masks required Thursdays only. Volunteers are no longer required to be vaccinated in order to participate in RWT activities. We still encourage masking as practicable due to the intimate nature of our theatre. More information can be found at our website. This policy took effect Nov. 1, 2022, and the first performance it affects is A Year with Frog and Toad, on our Rotary main stage, Dec. 8-11 and 15-18.

At the November 16 meeting, the Board of Directors approved a comprehensive five-year strategic plan for the theatre which touches all areas, including fundraising; implementing a new sound system; recruiting and retaining new tech volunteers; community outreach, engaging with, and welcoming new groups of people into our theatre community; and beyond.
