## **NOISES OFF promises fun-filled farce**

Let's face it: Many theater fans have a soft spot for a play within a play.

Especially if it's a funfilled, door-slamming, drawersdropping farce like Noises Off. Michael Frayn's perennial comedy takes the Riverwalk stage November 29-December 2 and December 6-9, directed by Michael Hays.

"I love this show because it's often called 'the funniest play ever written," Hays said.

"It is an incredibly challenging show for every single person involved in its production, with (hopefully) rib-splitting laughter."

According to theater lore, Frayn got the idea for the show while sitting backstage during a production of The Two of Us in 1970, a comedy he had written for Lynn Redgrave.

He liked that perspective and developed a one-act play called Exits in 1977, which was expanded into Noises Off in 1982.

In Riverwalk's latest version, Dave Dunckel plays

Lloyd Dallas, the director of a sex farce called Nothing On. It stars Dotty Otley, (Nita Haberlein) an aging TV star, as well as the much vounger Garry Lejeune (David Bilbey), whom she is dating. There's also actress Brooke Ashton, (Cassie Little) who is always losing her contact lenses; Frederick Fellowes (Greg Pratt), Belinda Blair (Maureen Sawdon) and Selsdon Mowbray, a famed old actor with a drinking problem (John Liskey). Erin Hoffman is Poppy Norton Taylor, assistant stage manager and understudy; Gabe Weeks plays Tim Allgood, the stage manager.

The set — featuring both front and backstage views is much more than a simple backdrop.

"While there's enough to make the audience really care about the characters, the main star of the whole show might very

well be the set, which has to completely spin around twice!!" Hays said.

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## Jitney - a powerful producton

"It was easy for the world to ignore August Wilson. He was the guy in the corner of a bar or cafe, with an open notebook and an open ear." This is a quote from a review by Mike Hughes of a PBS documentary about the life of August Wilson, the 20th Century's comprehensive chronicler of African-American life.

Director Vanessa Sanders successfully brought to Riverwalk Jitney, the third of his ten decade-by-decade "Pittsburgh Cycle" plays. The ensemble cast of eight men and one woman captured the authentic-sounding interplay between the drivers of a low cost car service, or "jitney," facing the threat of urban renewal in 1977.

All of the characters delivered distinct personalities, most impressively Bruce Wade as the founder/manager of this under-the-radar business, Guy Thomas as the trouble-making comic relief, and Chance Boyd as a lovable drunk. Lekeathon Wilson, Guy Stockard, Marcus Turner, Ralph Sims and Ken Nelson were all believable, along with Janell Hall as a long-suffering girlfriend.

The cast was ably backed-up by producer Bernie Lucas, stage manager Claudia Allen, property mistress Evon Anderson, costumer Marina White-Villanueva, sound designer Ann Glenn Carlson, light designer Nick Eaton, music designer OraLee Cunningham, with set design and construction of a realistic bare-bones office by Bob Nees and Marlon Torres.
